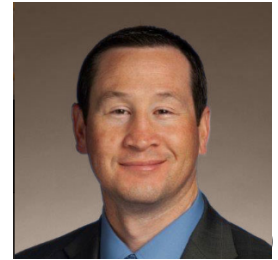

Limited Government	<a href="#">HB0640 / SB0479</a>	Redefines money and paves the way for a Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC). Was amended to replace all the bad text with a simple statement that CBDCs are not bank accounts in Tennessee.	Yes	Yes
	<a href="#">HB1695 / SB2020</a>	Allows the state to hide autopsies to avoid public scrutiny.	No	Yes
	<a href="#">HB1894 / SB1903</a>	Defines food with a vaccine or vaccine material as a drug.	Yes	Yes
	<a href="#">HB2063 / SB2691</a>	Prohibits the spraying of chemicals and particulates, known as geo-engineering, into our air.	Yes	Yes
	<a href="#">HB2119 / SB1983</a>	Requires the government to prove that eminent domain is in the best interest of the public before taking or condemning property.	Yes	Yes
	<a href="#">HJR0820</a>	Opposes expansion of the World Health Organization's authority and supports ending U.S. government funding of the organization.	Yes	Yes
Medical Freedom	<a href="#">HB1726 / SB2359</a>	Ends the immunization requirement to adopt or foster a child.	Yes	Yes
	<a href="#">HB1883 / SB1641</a>	Allows daily hospital visits, even during a state of emergency.	Yes	Yes
Second Amendment	<a href="#">HB2861 / SB2151</a>	Prohibits vaccination coercion and requirement deception.	Yes	Yes

### Additional Notes:

- **HB1632**, which would have allowed parents to sue to remove porn from schools, was "taken off notice" in Chairman Hicks' committee to die.
- **HB1616**, which would require voters to declare their party or choose "unaffiliated" in a primary election, was "placed behind the budget" in Chairman Hicks' committee to die.
- **HB2803** and **HB2804**, which would have established sound money in Tennessee, were "placed behind the budget" and "returned to the clerk's desk," respectively, in Chairman Hicks' committee to die.
- **HJR0038**, which would expand protection for our right to keep and bear arms was "taken off notice" in Chairman Hicks' committee to die.
