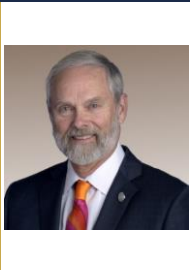

## NAUGHTY & NICE — Notable Votes & Sponsorships

- Voted No on HB0886 – NAUGHTY: Candidates must remove their election signs within 2 weeks after elections. (Caption bill: Requires an individual to register as a member of a statewide political party, a recognized minor party, or as unaffiliated, at the time of initial registration).
- Voted No on HB1159 – NAUGHTY: When registering to vote, the individual must include the political party they are affiliated with or state “unaffiliated”.
- Voted No on HB1716 – NAUGHTY: Taxes will be assessed at the last price paid for the property or when refinanced.
- Voted No on HB1897 – NAUGHTY: All counties will run through the SAVE program voter registration application prior to adding to voter rolls.
- Voted Yes on HB1971 – NAUGHTY: Bill will prevent organizations/citizens from suing regarding unconstitutional legislation unless they have standing. Bill Amended to read: Specifies that such cause of action does not apply to challenges to the validity or constitutionality of state law.
- Voted No on HB2304 – NAUGHTY: Creates early voting satellite location for no more than 4 precincts, also requires watermarked paper ballots.
- Voted No on HB2419 – NAUGHTY: Before an annexation can be approved, the municipality shall submit where the property is located, a financial impact study, financial viability and approval by majority of county legislative body.
- Voted abstain on HB2610 – NAUGHTY: enacts the "Restoring State Sovereignty Through Nullification Act," which establishes processes by which the general assembly may nullify an unconstitutional federal statute, regulation, agency order, or executive order.
- Voted Yes on HB0022 – A governing body shall, for each public meeting, reserve a period for public comment to provide the public with the opportunity to comment.
- Voted Yes on HB0458 – Requires board of elections to verify monthly voter rolls w/ regards to non-citizens. Verify via SAVE database.
- Voted Yes on HB0851 – Makes changes to the process of voting absentee with regards to federal uniformed and overseas citizens.
- Voted Yes on HB1666 – includes "honorifics"(honor/respect) with respects to the prohibition on requiring a student, teacher, state employee, or state contractor to use or provide a person's preferred name or pronoun.
- Voted Yes on HB1706 – Illegal immigrants cannot lawfully operate a commercial motor vehicle in TN.
- Voted Yes on HB1708 – A restricted driver's license will be issued for one year only for individuals who don't speak or read English.
- Voted Yes on HB1711 – The law enforcement agency shall include in its quarterly reports those persons arrested or otherwise detained for violations of federal immigration laws including gang activities.
- Voted Yes on HB1788 – Foreign entities are prohibited from acquiring interests in non-agricultural land.
- Voted Yes on HB1817 – An “out of service order” will be issued to a commercial driver who is unable to read and speak English.
- Voted Yes on HB1873 – The governing body of a local government shall direct the county election commission to hold a referendum election to raise a real property tax rate by an amount that exceeds the limitations previously set.
- Voted Yes on HB2018 – Law enforcement is required to accept & honor immigration detainees.
- Voted Yes on HB2076 – Creates a task force to evaluate the K-12 meal program with regards to ultra-processed foods.
