NAUGHTY & NICE — Notable Votes & Sponsorships

- Voted No on HB1072 – NAUGHTY: Govt cannot add criteria that will create a wetland where it was previously converted cropland.
- Voted Yes on HB1968 – NAUGHTY: Alvogen, Inc., Apotex Corp., and Zydus Pharmaceuticals (USA) Inc are included to be excused from pending or future opioid claims.
- Voted No on HB2396 – NAUGHTY: Prohibits fluoride from being added to public water systems.
- Voted No on HB2514 – NAUGHTY: A person protecting their property can threaten deadly force on a trespasser who refuses to leave.
- Voted Yes on HB2526 – NAUGHTY: A child who has exhibited or threatened violent behavior is one who is in need of heightened supervision.
- Voted Yes on HB0729 – It will be a Class C misd offense if an individual intentionally obstructs a highway, street, or other place used for the passage of vehicles.
- Voted Yes on HB0882 – the department of environment and conservation cannot regulate farming activities regarding topsoil, rock removal, or building of a pond if area is less than 3 acres and is considered a greenbelt area.
- Voted Yes on HB0884 – Updates definition of adult-oriented establishment to include any commercial establishment, business or service which offers sexually-oriented material, devices, paraphernalia or specified sexual activities.
- Voted Yes on HB0898 – Each utility system shall obtain a certificate of analysis for any water sold by the utility system that contains fluoride.
- Voted Yes on HB1271 – The policy of this state is that there are only two sexes, a biological male and a biological female.
- Voted Yes on HB1454 – Aggravating circumstances such as rape of a child under 4 and/or incest will be included for jury consideration.
- Voted Yes on HB1708 – An individual who cannot speak or read English proficiently will be issued a restricted driver's license for one year then they must retake the written drivers test in English only.
- Voted Yes on HB1802 – Deadly force is allowed in order to protect your property if you or others are in imminent danger.
- Voted Yes on HB1817 – An “out of service order” will be issued to a commercial driver who is unable to read and speak English.
- Voted Yes on HB1951 – Coercive suicide is an offense that will be charged for anyone who using AI encourages, advises someone to attempt or commit suicide.
- Voted Yes on HB2065 – Adds the offense of aggravated criminal trespass to include disruption of a religious assembly.
- Voted Yes on HB2082 – A parent may raise their child according to biological sex and decline gender transformation legally.
- Voted Yes on HB2202 – Expands the designation of scenic rivers that will not allow a landfill for solid or hazardous wastes to be established near its boundaries. This would include the Big South Fork of the Cumberland River.
- Voted Yes on HB2264 – It is a misdemeanor offense to interfere, obstruct or disturb a religious institution's activities by displaying, uttering or gesturing in a manner that is offensive.
- Voted Yes on HB2279 – Protects TN citizens/residents from transnational repression by foreign govt/terrorist organizations.
- Voted NO on HB0022/SB0178 – Legislation expanding citizen input at public meetings. TCGC Supports.
- COSPONSOR – HB0653: Cosponsored bill funding weaponization of government entities against conservative candidates and groups.
- Voted YES on HB0793 – Schools may refuse enrollment to students unlawfully present in the United States.
