NAUGHTY & NICE — Notable Votes & Sponsorships

- Voted No on HB0744 – NAUGHTY: any organization or entity that receives money from the state cannot deny benefits or participation based on DEI requirements.
- Voted No on HB1072 – NAUGHTY: Govt cannot add criteria that will create a wetland where it was previously converted cropland.
- Voted abstain on HB1666 – NAUGHTY: includes "honorifics"(honor/respect) with respects to the prohibition on requiring a student, teacher, state employee, or state contractor to use or provide a person's preferred name or pronoun.
- Voted Yes on HB1858 – NAUGHTY: The governing body of a local government shall direct the county election commission to hold a referendum election to raise a real property tax rate by an amount that exceeds the limitations previously set.
- Voted No on HB2202 – NAUGHTY: Expands the designation of scenic rivers that will not allow a landfill for solid or hazardous wastes to be established near its boundaries. This would include the Big South Fork of the Cumberland River.
- Voted No on HB2419 – NAUGHTY: Before an annexation can be approved, the municipality shall submit where the property is located, a financial impact study, financial viability and approval by majority of county legislative body.
- Voted Yes on HB0022 – A governing body shall, for each public meeting, reserve a period for public comment to provide the public with the opportunity to comment.
- Voted Yes on HB0458 – Requires board of elections to verify monthly voter rolls w/ regards to non-citizens. Verify via SAVE database.
- Voted Yes on HB0882 – the department of environment and conservation cannot regulate farming activities regarding topsoil, rock removal, or building of a pond if area is less than 3 acres and is considered a greenbelt area.
- Voted Yes on HB0886 – Candidates must remove their election signs within 2 weeks after elections. (Caption bill: Requires an individual to register as a member of a statewide political party, a recognized minor party, or as unaffiliated, at the time of initial registration).
- Voted Yes on HB0898 – Each utility system shall obtain a certificate of analysis for any water sold by the utility system that contains fluoride.
- Voted Yes on HB1159 – When registering to vote, the individual must include the political party they are affiliated with or state "unaffiliated".
- Voted Yes on HB1710 – Creates early voting satellite location for no more than 4 precincts, also requires watermarked paper ballots.
- Voted Yes on HB1711 – The law enforcement agency shall include in its quarterly reports those persons arrested or otherwise detained for violations of federal immigration laws including gang activities.
- Voted Yes on HB1788 – Foreign entities are prohibited from acquiring interests in non-agricultural land.
- Voted Yes on HB2018 – Law enforcement is required to accept & honor immigration detainees.
- Voted Yes on HB2396 – Prohibits fluoride from being added to public water systems.
- Voted Yes on HB2396 – prohibits public water system operators from adding fluoride to their water systems.
- Voted Yes on HB2610 – enacts the "Restoring State Sovereignty Through Nullification Act," which establishes processes by which the general assembly may nullify an unconstitutional federal statute, regulation, agency order, or executive order.
