NAUGHTY & NICE — Notable Votes & Sponsorships

- Voted No on HB0047 – NAUGHTY: Public/Charter schools may display the Ten Commandments, The Constitution (US & TN), The Bill of Rights and the Declaration of Independence in school buildings.
- Voted No on HB0291 – NAUGHTY: Requires higher education institutions to create a curriculum for understanding all the founding documents like the Constitution, etc.
- Voted No on HB0729 – NAUGHTY: It will be a Class C misdemeanor offense if an individual intentionally obstructs a highway, street, or other place used for the passage of vehicles.
- Voted No on HB0849 – NAUGHTY: Codifies the definition of a human being which does not include AI, a computer algorithm, software program or any type of machine.
- Voted No on HB0884 – NAUGHTY: Updates definition of adult-oriented establishment to include any commercial establishment, business or service which offers sexually-oriented material, devices, paraphernalia or specified sexual activities.
- Voted No on HB1271 – NAUGHTY: The policy of this state is that there are only two sexes, a biological male and a biological female.
- Voted No on HB1454 – NAUGHTY: Aggravating circumstances such as rape of a child under 4 and/or incest will be included for jury consideration.
- Voted No on HB1473 – NAUGHTY: Same sex marriage does not have to be recognized by private citizens and organizations.
- Voted No on HB1491 – NAUGHTY: A public school shall be allowed to teach except where personal exceptions are requested, the bible as literature.
- Voted No on HB1658 – NAUGHTY: First time teacher must pass a US civics test before licensure will be issued.
- Voted No on HB1666 – NAUGHTY: includes "honorifics"(honor/respect) with respects to the prohibition on requiring a student, teacher, state employee, or state contractor to use or provide a person's preferred name or pronoun.
- Voted No on HB1704 – NAUGHTY: It's a state-level offense to intentionally remain in the country in violation of a final deportation order, or to intentionally enter the country illegally.
- Voted No on HB1802 – NAUGHTY: Deadly force is allowed in order to protect your property if you or others are in imminent danger.
- Voted No on HB1805 – NAUGHTY: Requires schools to have instruction regarding the history of communism.
- Voted Yes on HB1968 – NAUGHTY: Alvogen, Inc., Apotex Corp., and Zydus Pharmaceuticals (USA) Inc are included to be excused from pending or future opioid claims.
- Voted No on HB2065 – NAUGHTY: Adds the offense of aggravated criminal trespass to include disruption of a religious assembly.
- Voted No on HB2082 – NAUGHTY: A parent may raise their child according to biological sex and decline gender transformation legally.
- Voted abstain on HB2279 – NAUGHTY: Protects TN citizens/residents from transnational repression by foreign govt/terrorist organizations.
- Voted Yes on HB2420 – NAUGHTY: Requires instead of authorizing, the sponsor of online virtual schools to close the schools at the direction of the commissioner of education.
- Voted No on HB2514 – NAUGHTY: A person protecting their property can threaten deadly force on a trespasser who refuses to leave.
- Voted Yes on SB1868 – NAUGHTY: A child who has exhibited or threatened violent behavior is one who is in need of heightened supervision.
- Voted No on HB1729 – If a home-school student does not test proficiently in the subject matter tested, then the test must be re-administered within 1 year. This effects grade 5, 7 & 9.
- Voted Yes on HB1733 – A teacher or school employee found to have committed an act of harassment, intimidation, bullying, or cyberbullying is subject to dismissal or suspension.
- Voted No on HB1823 – Students (who have truancy issues & have withdrawn without transferring) will be reported to juvenile court by the dir. of schools. HB1700 redo bill to scare parents away from homeschool and non-public schooling options.
- Voted No on HB1837 – A public entity who enacts a land use regulation that effect the fair market value of a property must pay just compensation. Bill would strengthen developer, property rights over local land use regulations.
- Voted Yes on HB1951 – Coercive suicide is an offense that will be charged for anyone who using AI encourages, advises someone to attempt or commit suicide.
- Voted No on HB1971 – Bill will prevent organizations/citizens from suing regarding unconstitutional legislation unless they have standing. Bill Amended to read: Specifies that such cause of action does not apply to challenges to the validity or constitutionality of state law.
- Voted Yes on HB2076 – Creates a task force to evaluate the K-12 meal program with regards to ultra-processed foods.
- Voted No on HB2526 – A child who has exhibited or threatened violent behavior is one who is in need of heightened supervision.
- Voted No on HB2532 – Awards 15,000 additional education scholarships in the 26/27 school year under the One, Big, Beautiful Act if Governor complies w/ all requirements of the Fed.
