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### NAUGHTY & NICE — Notable Votes & Sponsorships

- SPONSOR – Voted Yes on SB1968 – NAUGHTY: Students (who have truancy issues & have withdrawn without transferring) will be reported to juvenile court by the dir. of schools. HB1700 redo bill to scare parents away from homeschool and non-public schooling options.
- Voted Yes on SB2064 – NAUGHTY: The governing body of a local government shall direct the county election commission to hold a referendum election to raise a real property tax rate by an amount that exceeds the limitations previously set.
- Voted Yes on SB2247 – NAUGHTY: Awards 15,000 additional education scholarships in the 26/27 school year under the One, Big, Beautiful Act if Governor complies w/ all requirements of the Fed.
- Voted Yes on SB0047 – Public/Charter schools may display the Ten Commandments, The Constitution (US & TN), The Bill of Rights and the Declaration of Independence in school buildings.
- Voted Yes on SB0162 – Prohibits fluoride from being added to public water systems.
- SPONSOR – Voted Yes on SB0178 – A governing body shall, for each public meeting, reserve a period for public comment to provide the public with the opportunity to comment.
- Voted Yes on SB0259 – Parents and legal guardians will have access to all medical records resulting in treatments for their child.
- Voted Yes on SB0281 – the department of environment and conservation cannot regulate farming activities regarding topsoil, rock removal, or building of a pond if area is less than 3 acres and is considered a greenbelt area.
- Voted Yes on SB0367 – Requires board of elections to verify monthly voter rolls w/ regards to non-citizens. Verify via SAVE database.
- SPONSOR – Voted Yes on SB0777 – Candidates must remove their election signs within 2 weeks after elections. (Caption bill: Requires an individual to register as a member of a statewide political party, a recognized minor party, or as unaffiliated, at the time of initial registration).
- Voted Yes on SB0836 – Public schools and public charter may refuse to enroll illegal aliens.
- Voted Yes on SB1028 – All ballots cast by a voter in primary/general elections must have a visible secure watermark.
- Voted Yes on SB1029 – Makes changes to the process of voting absentee with regards to federal uniformed and overseas citizens.
- Voted Yes on SB1077 – Requires higher education institutions to create a curriculum for understanding all the founding documents like the Constitution, etc.
- Voted Yes on SB1142 – Each utility system shall obtain a certificate of analysis for any water sold by the utility system that contains fluoride.
- Voted Yes on SB1665 – includes "honorifics"(honor/respect) with respects to the prohibition on requiring a student, teacher, state employee, or state contractor to use or provide a person's preferred name or pronoun.
- Voted Yes on SB1714 – A public school shall be allowed to teach except where personal exceptions are requested, the bible as literature.
- Voted Yes on SB1890 – Requires schools to have instruction regarding the history of communism.
- Voted Yes on SB1915 – Creates early voting satellite location for no more than 4 precincts, also requires watermarked paper ballots.
- Voted Yes on SB1922 – Requires state and local governments to verify citizenship status using E-Verify.
- Voted Yes on SB2122 – Creates a task force to evaluate the K-12 meal program with regards to ultra-processed foods.
- Voted Yes on SB2172 – Expands the designation of scenic rivers that will not allow a landfill for solid or hazardous wastes to be established near its boundaries. This would include the Big South Fork of the Cumberland River.
- Voted Yes on SB2310 – Public schools/charter schools and teachers will not be allowed to use any digital devices for or during instructional time.
